FACILITIES/BUILDING & GROUNDS COMMITTEE

The mission of the Facilities/B&G Committee is to preserve and maintain our church facility in good and safe operating condition; and to properly evaluate, plan and execute capital improvement projects based on need, purpose, and priority.

The Committee continues to work diligently for the preservation and maintenance of our Church Facility, while making sure that every dollar is spent carefully and responsively. The following is a summary of projects and activities completed or undertaken this year so far:

Recently Completed work includes:

The much-needed refinishing of the church doors and the repairs to the door thresholds were recently completed. A big shout out to the people who spent two Friday afternoons removing and reinstalling the doors and repairing the thresholds, namely: Chris Charas, Marinos Lilikas, Nick Katsapis, Peter Hilaris, Marios Socrates, Tasos Miltiadous and Elias Prastos who did a phenomenal job refinishing the doors in his shop for three weeks! The cost of the



refinishing is \$6,500 and it was all donated by George & Harriet Prepis who are the initial donors of the doors. Thank you!

Pavement Milling/resurfacing – Completed the much-needed milling/resurfacing of the deteriorated pavement at the entrance driveways, around the circle areas, and other sporadic pavement repairs throughout the parking lot for a cost of \$53,500.



The yearly cleaning and refinishing of all the downstairs classrooms, library and hallways floors as well as the carpet cleaning inside the fellowship hall, the ceramic tile cleaning of the atrium floor and dance floor and the cleaning of the kitchen floor were completed in July. The cost of these necessary refinishing and cleaning maintenance was \$8,000 for downstairs and \$3,400 for upstairs. The PTO donated \$4,000 towards the downstairs floor refinishing. Thank you!



Kitchen and storage corridor light fixtures

replacement – Several existing ceiling light fixtures in the kitchen and storage corridor did not work and we replaced all 21 fixtures with new energy efficient LED fixtures. Under a NJ energy savings subsidy program, we received an \$800 rebate, and the entire project cost was \$1,850



Gym floor Refinishing – Due to the excessive use of gym by our youth and the rental entity, we initiated a yearly maintenance (refinishing) of the gym floor. This extend the useful life of the floor and reduce extensive



our will and

expensive replacement in the short run. The cost for this year's refinishing was \$2,530.

Replace and improve the Altar sink and cabinets area – The Altar sink and adjacent cabinets were deteriorated and in need of replacement, renovated and painted. Jimmy Zervoudis led this project and renovated the area with new cabinets, shelving, etc. to fit the needs of Fr. Gregory. Jimmy donated all labor and materials (estimated cost is \$5K). Thank you!



Construction of a handicap curb cut and repair of the settled sidewalk - The settled sidewalk in front of the Atrium/Gym entrance created a safety/ tripping hazard. This project addressed this issue and also created the missing handicap access curb cut adjacent to the existing handicap ramp leading to the Atrium/Gym entrance. The cost of this project was \$5,400.



Gym Roof Replacement – The 40-year-old existing roof was leaking due to cracking of the aged shingles. The roof was replaced at a cost of \$33,800.



Repairs to the heating boiler \$2,049.

Inspection & routine maintenance of the gym doors \$950

Miscellaneous interior maintenance repairs throughout the church facility.

Work in Progress or Under Consideration Includes:

Church Dome Repairs – As you may have noticed, some of the blue tiles on the dome debonded and were removed for safety reasons. The "Kemper" roof membrane below the tiles is intact and in good condition. As a temporary measure, and until we evaluate and consider a permanent rehabilitation scheme, the B&G recommended removing any other loose tiles and coating the exposed roof membrane with a compatible "Kemper" blue color coating. We are currently waiting for the material delivery in September for the restoration contractor (Skyline Restoration) to perform the work.

Heating Boiler piping replacement – Several pipes connecting to the heating boiler inside the boiler room are deteriorated and leaking. We are in the process of obtaining cost proposals for the pipe replacements.

- Replacement of the office area roof
- Replacement of the Chapel area roof

- Renovation of the priest's office
- Fellowship Hall audio/video equipment
- Replacement of Concrete Steps at Atrium Entrance
- Replacement of the entrance monument and installation of flag poles
- Mill and repave the west parking lot
- Mill and repave the south & east parking lot
- Replacement of old kitchen equipment
- Renovation of Vestry areas

We would like to thank all who contributed towards the maintenance and preservation needs of our Church and we wish everyone a healthy and blessed New Ecclesiastical Year!
